Lynch**

Let`s move on !

Christy Lynch - founder member of both the Irish Association of Supported Employment (IASE) and the first President of the EUSE. Christy is Chief Executive Officer of KARE which provides a comprehensive range of services for individuals with intellectual disabilities and their families. Christy has significant experience in the development of Inclusive Employment Options, specifically Supported Employment for people with disabilities. Christy is nationally and internationally recognized for his pioneering work in achieving integrated employment for individuals with a disability. He has worked tirelessly in the pursuit of equal employment opportunities, not only in Ireland, but also throughout Europe, the Far East, South America, South Africa and Russia running seminars and lectures to professionals, academics, parents and umbrella organizations. He has been actively involved with the European Disability Forum, the European Commission and with the European Parliament on Disability Employment Policy for several years. In 1995 he was awarded an International Award for Community Integration and Employment by the Joseph P. Kennedy Jr., Foundation on Mental Retardation. He was also the first international recipient of the Kennedy Foundation International Policy Fellowship on Disability.

The Monetary Benefits and Costs of Supported Employment

Prior to earning his Ph.D. in special education from the University of Illinois in 1997, Robert Ciemera worked with individuals with disabilities both as a job coach and a coordinator of supported employment services. His research primarily explores the economics of supported employment and ways of improving vocational outcomes while reducing costs to taxpayers. He has over fifty publications, including seven books.

People with disabilities have the right to work

As chairman of the Disabled Peoples Organizations Denmark since 2000, Mr. Stig Langvad has a strong record on promoting the rights of persons with disabilities. In this capacity, Mr. Stig Langvad has been known for his commitment to and deep knowledge of problems facing persons with different kinds of disabilities.

Stig Langvad holds an MSc in political science (University of Aarhus, Denmark) and has considerable experience as an independent political adviser, analyst and planner in the field of social affairs.

Mr. Stig Langvad has significant international experience in working with disability issues. Among other important positions, Mr. Langvad has been a member of the European Disability Forum (EDF) Board of Directors since 2001 and a member of EDF's Executive Committee since 2009. Mr. Langvad also has extensive knowledge of how to address disability issues in a development context.

1 September 2010 he was elected as an expert member of the International committee following the UN Convention on the rights of Persons with disabilities.

Activating Disability Benefits: reforming benefit entitlements and employment services

Dan Finn is Professor of Social Inclusion at the University of Portsmouth and Associate Director at the independent Centre for Economic and Social Inclusion. His research interests include the reform of public employment services, activation and the implementation of welfare to work strategies. He has been a special adviser for parliamentary inquiries and has undertaken many commissioned research projects. Dan has a particular interest in contracting out and has completed recent studies of 'welfare markets' in the UK, USA, the Netherlands and Australia'.
